" We want to create and show different works of art in different price ranges, part of the sales of which will go towards good causes." informed one artist Sunil Mehta for the exhibition supported by NGO's - El Shaddai and Society for Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (SPCA). Among other artists whose works will be on display include Geeta Sahu (pottery), Garima Singh (Tanjore and multimedia paintings), Mrinal Nigde (tile and glass paintings). Tulika Sharma (crafts, furniture, decor and murals), Veena Satish (abstract works) and Sunil Mehta (oil and acryclic).

Addressing mediapersons, Mehta said the aim behind organising this exhibition was scouring for an opportunity. Hence, the group of six artists came together to hold this expo.
